Created for Baron Ferdinand, the cast-iron Aviary in the grounds of the stately home Waddesdon Manor, pays stylistic tribute to the rococo trelliswork pavilions erected in the early 18th century in Versailles and Chantilly. Housing 70 species of birds the priority of any redevelopment works was the welfare of the birds and the priceless buildings and gardens that surround them, a strict brief stated no flames were to be used within a six metre perimeter during the work and maintaining low-levels of noise pollution to minimise stress on the birds was imperative.

Bauder's flame free reinforced bitumen membrane System Airtech was the obvious choice; already established as a leader in revolutionary roofing solutions. The self-adhesive underlay and capping sheet were installed using hi-tech hot air welding of laps to give an aesthetically pleasing finish.
